This program is designed to help senior and disabled residents of Claremont, La Verne, Pomona and San Dimas who can't easily use existing transportation. Program participants recruit their own volunteer drivers from among their friends and neighbors. Passengers then have the means to reimburse them for mileage costs. The program is allowed to cross city and county lines, but most importantly it provides an opportunity for volunteers to share companionship and friendships. And that's the whole idea behind Community Senior Services, which is acting as the umbrella agency. Community Connections staff will do extensive phone interviews with applicants. THE SENIOR GOLF LEAGUE OF LA VERNE



We have launched our 2015 competition with a round of "Hate 'Em" on January 13th and a round of the "Pinehurst two-person team" format on January 27th. In the former, each player was able to identify, in advance, three holes he hates and give himself an automatic par on each of them. In the latter, we paired a long hitter with a short hitter. After each player hit their tee shots, they played their partner's ball to complete the each hole. The player with the lowest score on each hole, using handicaps, was the score recorded for the team.

In January we also began signing up the players who were interested in being part of the 2015 La Verne Senior Golf League Cup competition. Last year, Art Hernandez won the cup among the First Flight players, while Soc Galam won it among the Second Flight players. Points awarded to the top 5 players in each flight each time we play. The two players with the most points at the end of October will split the pot created by each player's entry fee of \$5 for this competition. Players must sign up for this competition through February.

We will play twice in February at Marshall Canyon on the 10th and the 24th. We ask each golfer to be at the course

by 8:30 AM for our first tee time at 9:00 AM.

Other than the green and cart fees paid to the course, we charge \$5 per golfer to provide the prizes we award each time we play. The green fee, with a cart, is \$26.25 if you have an LA County Senior Golf Card. Golfers 65+ can obtain this card for a \$28 annual fee at Marshall Canyon, or at any other LA County Golf Course. With it, you get a 50% reduction on your green fee at any of the 19 LA County Golf Courses. It's a good deal!


