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


INCLUSION POLICY

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WORKING TO MITIGATE THE CONTINUING DROUGHT

Throughout the winter we enjoyed a significant drop in temperatures and have seen some rain over the past months! This is good news in regards to our decade-long drought, but by no means does this signal an end to the drought or the risk of running out of water. In fact, our region is estimated to need over 300% of an average rainfall year to get back to average precipitation levels. As of early spring, Southern California reservoirs were significantly below their historical average for the time of year and most were at about 50% of total capacity. The large Northern California reservoirs, Shasta and Oroville, are currently near their capacity, but lower than average snowpack means they will not be refilled throughout the dry summer months. While California has had more rainfall this year, it is still below what would be needed for a serious recovery from the drought. This means that continued conservation is needed in order to improve our water shortage. Water use was down marginally in the winter compared to 2013 consumption. These reductions, while helpful, fall short of our state mandated target. The community reached this conservation standard last summer and conservation is still important throughout the year. As temperatures rise through the summer it is even more critical to continue with a conservation mindset to reduce the effects of our continuing drought. The City is offering programs to promote water efficient alternatives outside and leading by example with drought efficient alternatives at many of our parks and public buildings. Together we can do it!

The City of La Verne continues to offer \$1.50 per square foot for turf removal. The program has a maximum rebate of \$2,000 per water account. Drought tolerant gardens use approximately 75% less water, generate about half as much waste and require approximately 60% less maintenance than traditional turf.

In addition to rebates, many turf to drought tolerant conversions have been completed by the City of La Verne over the past year. Please visit our new drought tolerant gardens at City Hall, Rustic Canyon Park, Heritage Park, Live Oak Park, Oak Mesa Park, Wheeler Park, Mills Park, Emerald Park, Las Flores Park and Los Encinos Park. Most of the costs for these transformations were covered by a grant through Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. Two premiere projects were completed at Lowell Brandt Park on Stephens Ranch Road and Fire Station 2, located at 4785 Wheeler Avenue. Lowell Brandt had a complete overhaul, which included removal of almost an acre of shrubs that were replaced with less water intensive greenery. While the ground was exposed, maintenance was conducted on environmental features of the park to aid in groundwater recharge. Once the new planting was completed, green waste (mulch and wood chips) was used to aid in erosion control and weed blockage while maintaining moisture and keeping more waste out of the landfills. Fire Station 2, has utilized drought tolerant landscaping to promote wise water use. The grass was replaced with decomposed granite, recycled concrete chunks and water efficient plants creating a wonderful example of a tranquil and environmentally friendly garden.



REDUCING, REUSING, AND RECYCLING IN LA VERNE



Reduce, Reuse, Recycle has become the slogan of recycling in California, but what can the residents of La Verne do to help? A lot! An important part of sustainability is thinking about how much waste we all create and ways to reduce it. Some of the smallest changes in our daily habits can have large effects. For example, buying in bulk instead of individual servings helps reduce your waste stream. Maintaining and repairing products like clothing and appliances can cut down on the frequency of your purchases. Donating what you don't need, so that less of your products go to landfills fulfills the needs of others without utilizing more precious resources. Creating less waste, while saving money makes everyone a winner and reduces your environmental impact.

For items that you can't reduce or reuse, you can recycle! Recycling saves money and energy in manufacturing, improves the local environment and saves resources. Items that can be recycled aren't limited to just water bottles, soda cans, and newspapers either... bathrooms and home offices can generate large amounts of recyclable waste. Used shampoo bottles, empty tissue boxes, toilet paper rolls, envelopes, cardboard, packaging materials and computer paper are all recyclable. By recycling the plastics, aluminum, and paper that we send to landfills daily, we are contributing to a more sustainable community.

Another method of recycling that is gaining ground is composting. Composting is the act of combining organic material, such as fallen leaves and yard trimmings with kitchen scraps, letting it decompose into a nutrient rich soil and returning it to plants. The organic material that you might throw away contains many nutrients that help promote plant growth and health. Parts that you can't eat like egg shells or banana peels make perfect food for plants after decaying into organic material. Compost improves the quality of your soil and the health of your plants. YFAC WORD

IT'S OK TO TALK ABOUT IT

Why are we so uncomfortable discussing mental health? It affects how we think, feel and act. It helps determine how we handle stress, relate to others and make choices. Mental health is important at every stage of life, from childhood and adolescence through adulthood. Mental health problems are common but help is available so don't avoid discussing this important issue with your family.

Common issues youth seek individual counseling for are:

- Depressive Symptoms (sadness, isolation, lack of motivation, self-esteem)
- School Related (bullying, poor behavior, anger, outbursts, academics, social/peer interactions)
- Family Issues (financial, divorce or domestic violence, illness and/or death)
- Anxiety & Stress
- Substance Abuse

Roles Parents can Play:

- Talk to your child about the importance of mental health – let them know it doesn't make a person odd or weird to need assistance. In fact, one in five American adults experience a mental health issue each year.
- Get them assistance if needed - early mental health support can help a child before problems interfere with other developmental needs. Counseling services are provided through local schools.
- Help yourself - keep in mind that it is also important take care of your own mental health.

Counseling Programs are Available

Counseling services are provided for La Verne community's youth at local schools. Programs are provided as an opportunity for students to have an exchange with professionals regarding challenging issues they are facing. Through this, counselors try to immediately defuse the situation, work with the student on a short-term basis, or if necessary, assist parents in finding long-term counseling services.

The City of La Verne Youth and Family Action Committee is a formal committee of the City, comprised of representatives from private agencies, non-profit organizations, La Verne Police Department, Bonita Unified School District, the City, and many interested citizens. With the committee's focal point on trying to address challenges that confront our youth, before they grow into greater concerns, we are constantly made aware of new trends. On the premise that knowledge is power the committee has created the "YFAC Word" as a way to pass that information on to parents so they too can be aware of these potential issues.



SUBSIDIZED PROGRAMS

To purchase these passes, residents must provide proof of La Verne residency in the form of a current utility bill AND proof of current employment from an agency located along the westward bus/train route. Quantities are limited and tickets will be sold on a first-come, first-served basis. For current subsidized rates, please contact us at (909) 596-8700.

FOOTHILL TRANSIT SUBSIDY – Commuter Express bus line on TAP card. Monthly Foothill Transit passes may be purchased from the 25th of each month through the 10th day of the following month.

SENIOR BUS PASS PROGRAM – The City offers a Senior Bus Pass Program for La Verne residents. Seniors, ages 62 or older, may purchase a Foothill Transit senior bus pass for a subsidized fee. Seniors need to provide proof of age as well as proof of La Verne residency in the form of a current utility bill.

METROLINK SUBSIDY – Monthly passes are available from the Pomona Station to destinations along the westward route. Monthly Metrolink passes may be purchased starting the 20th of each month for the following month. Once registered for the Metrolink Subsidy program with Community Services, monthly passes may also be purchased online.

METRO ACCESS

Metro Access is a curb-to-curb transportation service designed for people with disabilities who are unable to use traditional bus and train service such as the MTA or Foothill Transit services. 


