

COMMUNITY SENIOR SERVICES VOLUNTEER ESCORT/DRIVER REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

This program is designed to help senior and disabled residents of Claremont, La Verne, Pomona and San Dimas who can't easily use existing transportation. Program participants recruit their own volunteer drivers from among their friends and neighbors. Passengers then have the means to reimburse them for mileage costs. The program is allowed to cross city and county lines, but most importantly it provides an opportunity for volunteers to share companionship and friendships. And that's the whole idea behind Community Senior Services, which is acting as the umbrella agency. Community Connections staff will do extensive phone interviews with applicants. THE SENIOR GOLF LEAGUE OF LA VERNE



We have begun our competition for 2016 with a round of Yellow Ball on January 12 and a round of Odd/Even in two-man teams on January 26. We will play twice in February. On February 9th we'll play "Hate-Em" a format that allows each golfer to toss out his score on 3 of the 18 holes he'll play on that day. Our format for February 23 is yet to be determined. (If you think there's too much use of male terms in the foregoing sentences, it's because we have no female members in our group. We would welcome some women to join our group. And, if that happens, we promise to recognize that this group is not just a bunch of "old men.")

On January 12 we had 18 golfers sign up for the 2016 La Verne Senior Golf Cup competition. This involves a ten month period of competition in which those who sign-up and pay the princely sum of \$5 for the year will win points each time they finish in the top five of our bi-monthly competitions. The two golfers, one in Flight #1 with a handicap of 25 or below, and one in Flight #2 with a handicap of 26+, who earn the most points between January and the end of October will win trophies for their efforts and will split the pot of money. Last year our two winners-Art Hernandez and Soc Galam-each won \$40 for finishing first in their respective flights in the La Verne Senior Cup Competition. The deadline to register for this 10-month competition is February 23.

We play on the second and fourth Tuesdays of the month beginning at 9:00 AM. We also play the fifth Tuesdays when they occur with the first one of those in 2016 coming up on March 29.

We are glad to learn that the proposed development of Marshall Canyon by Lewis Homes is not going to happen as per an article in the Daily Bulletin on January 19th. We think that all of our members signed the petition protesting the sale of Marshall Canyon to Lewis Homes. We're glad "our course" has been saved from being developed with houses. Having said that, we'd love to see the County Board of Supervisors upgrade the course with cart paths from the first tee box to the eighteenth green, among other things.

Other than the green and cart fees paid to the course, we charge \$5 per golfer to provide for the prizes we award each time we play. The green fee, with a cart, is \$28.25 with the LA County Senior Golf Card.

Golfers 65+ can obtain the aforementioned Senior Card, which is good for one year from the date of purchase, for a \$28 fee at Marshall Canyon, or at any other LA County Golf Course. With it, you get a 50% reduction on your green fee at any of the 19 LA County Golf Courses. When you've played two rounds, you've paid for the cost of your card. After that, it's money going into your pocket.

SENIOR SOCIAL CLUB

The annual fee is \$5 per member and \$.50 per week. This covers the cost of the Christmas Luncheon, other feasts, coffee, tea & supplies. We will be happy to teach you Pinochle if you don't already know how. During our last session we had 2 tables playing Pinochle which is great fun. We play Pinochle and tile games or anything that you care to bring into our Monday sessions. We also play Mexican Mule Train and Kings in the Corner in the afternoon.


