

COMMUNITY SENIOR SERVICES VOLUNTEER ESCORT/DRIVER REIMBURSEMENT PROGRAM

This program is designed to help senior and disabled residents of Claremont, La Verne, Pomona and San Dimas who can't easily use existing transportation. Program participants recruit their own volunteer drivers from among their friends and neighbors. Passengers then have the means to reimburse them for mileage costs. The program is allowed to cross city and county lines, but most importantly it provides an opportunity for volunteers to share companionship and friendships. And that's the whole idea behind Community Senior Services, which is acting as the umbrella agency. Community Connections staff will do extensive phone interviews with applicants. THE SENIOR GOLF LEAGUE OF LA VERNE



The deadline for submitting articles for inclusion in the Senior Newsletter does not allow us to report the names of our 2016 Club Champions. After Round #1, we know that Bob Garcia has a 3 stroke lead over Mike Tierno in Flight #1 and that Marv Stolarz has a 1 shot lead over Soc Galam in Flight #2. The final round of our two-rounds of competition is scheduled for October 25th, so we will announce the names of our Club Champions in this space in December.

In November, we are going to play on 3 Tuesdays, 11/8, 11/22 and 11/29 since November has 5 Tuesdays this year. We are going to use the Ryder Cup format for those three rounds. So we will be competing in match play, in two teams, on all three dates in November. Our Captains will draw the members of their teams on October 25th. We will wrap up the year with a 4-Man Scramble on Tuesday, December 13th.

Also in November, we are going to have our annual party during which time we'll award trophies to our 2016 Club Champions and also award the trophies, actual metal cups, that go to the two golfers, one in Flight #1 and one in Flight #2, who have accumulated the most points since January in our annual La Verne Senior Golf Competition. The winners keep the cups, bearing their names and the year in which they won, for one year. Marv Stolarz has already clinched the cup among Flight #2

Players with 290 points. No one can catch him. However in Flight #1, it's going to come down to the wire. Art Hernandez, the defending Cup champion, and Ed Linberg are tied with 215 points. Ruben Triana has 200 points. One of these three golfers will likely win the cup for Flight #1 this year in the final round of the Club Championship on October 25th. The party, at which all the trophies will be presented, is set for Saturday, November 12th at Noon at the home of Marv and Carol Stolarz. We thank them for opening their home to us for this event.

If the holiday season is a time that's so busy there's no time for you to play golf, then plan to join us as we begin the new year on January 10th. More about our plans for 2017 will be in both the December and January issues of this Newsletter.

For your information, particularly if you are considering becoming a new member, other than the green and cart fees paid to the course, we charge \$5 per golfer to provide for the prizes we award each time we play. The green fee, with a cart, is \$28.75 with the LA County Senior Golf Card. Golfers 65+ can obtain this Card, which is good for one year from the date of purchase, for \$28 at Marshall Canyon, or at any other LA County Golf Course. With it, you get a 50% reduction of your green fee at any of the 19 LA County Golf Courses, including the nearby Mountain Meadows and Diamond Bar courses. When you've played 2 rounds, you've paid for the cost of the card. After that, it's money going into your pocket and what golfer doesn't like that!

SENIOR SOCIAL CLUB

The annual fee is \$5 per member and \$.50 per week. This covers the cost of the Christmas Luncheon, other feasts, coffee, tea & supplies.
