





COMMUNITY EMERGENCY RESPONSE TEAM

The City of La Verne is establishing a Community Emergency Response Team (CERT) to assist our Fire and Police Departments in response to local emergency situations. The CERT program helps train people to be better prepared to respond to emergency situations in their communities. When emergencies happen, CERT members can give critical support to first responders, provide immediate assistance to victims, and organize spontaneous volunteers at a disaster site. CERT members can also help with non-emergency projects that help improve the safety of the community.

The CERT course is taught in the community by a trained team of first responders who have completed a CERT Train-the-Trainer course conducted by their state training office for emergency management, or FEMA's Emergency Management Institute (EMI). CERT training includes disaster preparedness, disaster fire suppression, basic disaster medical operations and light search and rescue operations.

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


OPPORTUNITIES FOR RECYCLING

One of the largest improvements that can be made for recycling in La Verne is improving business recycling. Two laws from the California State Assembly, AB 341 and AB 1826, have been passed in recent years in order to increase traditional and organic recycling for businesses. California is a national leader in recycling and businesses reducing waste or using these recycling programs is an important part of maintaining that. Increasing the materials that are recycled instead of thrown away is an investment in air and water quality, greenhouse gas reduction, and energy efficiency. Existing traditional recycling avenues for products like plastics, cardboard, metals, and paper are the simplest way for businesses to improve their recycling rates. Using and tracking existing recycling avenues will also lessen the requirement on businesses to adopt new organic recycling requirements. Finding ways for businesses to both reduce the waste they create and increase traditional and organics recycling when necessary is an important part of making La Verne a more green community.

The average Californian recycles about 50% of the waste they create such as plastic, aluminum, and glass. Typically La Verne residents will recycle at slightly greater rates. For those looking for other ways to reduce waste though, adopting different avenues for recycling such as household hazardous waste recycling and organic recycling can improve recycling rates further. Recycling more products reduces money and energy required for manufacturing, produces jobs, protects natural resources and improves air and water quality. Increasing recycling rates is one of the most important environmental goals for California. The goal can be achieved by not only increasing awareness what can be recycled, but by increasing avenues for businesses and multi-family residences (such as apartment residents) to recycle.

Residents can take advantage of Household Hazardous Waste (HHW) Roundups to dispose of electronic waste, paint, household cleaners, batteries, and many other products that contain dangerous chemicals. The HHW Roundups are held throughout the county and tend to be close to La Verne frequently. Proper disposal of these chemicals, at events such as HHW Roundups prevent chemicals from polluting local environments and surface waters or seeping into groundwater. In water, these chemicals can pollute water supplies or harm wildlife along our rivers and oceans. E-Waste Roundups, meant for electronics like computers or televisions, are also frequently held by organizations, like businesses or universities near La Verne, and can have similar environmental benefits. Another option for recycling that La Verne residents can make is diverting food waste to their green waste containers. Food waste is a large contributor to what most Californians will wrongly throw away when it can be used to create compost or alternative daily cover. Compost helps to grow new food while alternative daily cover is used to infill and cover landfills. Taking advantage of these opportunities to recycle is a significant part of increasing recycling rates and local sustainability.



CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

On December 26th and January 2nd, Waste Management will be picking up Christmas trees that have been placed curbside for recycling. If your tree is six feet or more, please cut it in half and avoid flocked trees if possible, as they cannot be recycled.

REDUCING HOLIDAY WASTE

With Thanksgiving and Christmas right around the corner, soon to be followed by dad's and grads, the City of La Verne encourages you to maintain your traditions, but add new twists to help reduce landfill contributions. Throughout the holiday and gift giving season a tremendous increase in waste is regularly seen, most of it is paper. Whether that paper started as a card, wrapped a gift or helped protect a gift during shipping, the environmental impact of that paper will be upon this planet long after the joy of the occasion is gone. Below are some tips to cut down on paper waste.

- Send ½ sheet photo cards or postcards for holiday greetings, instead of more paper intensive thick card stock paper and envelopes. They're usually cheaper to purchase and mail.
- Better yet, consider sending FREE electronic cards, these add sounds and animation to be enjoyed by those around the world without the cost of postage or paper to get there.
- Buy gifts that require minimal wrapping, such as gift cards or concert tickets.
- Suggest that family and friends don't purchase new gifts but gather to volunteer at a hospital, convalescent home or homeless shelter. The memories you create will most likely outlive tangible gifts for you and those you're helping.
- Reuse shipping material for wrapping paper. Apply some stickers or have your children decorate it to add custom pizzazz.
- Eliminate shipping by purchasing gifts locally. This helps reduce waste and keeps more of your money within our community.



DON'T BE A VICTIM OF IRS PHONE SCAMS

Scammers have been busy this summer, and there does not appear to be any relief in sight. The IRS claims that phone scams are up 400% in 2016, with over 5,000 victims having paid out approximately \$26.5 million since 2013.

On any given day the La Verne Police Department receives two to five calls from citizens who have been contacted by these scammers demanding payment. They report that the calls begin in the early morning hours, sometimes before 6:00am, and continue into the late evening. The callers are often described as being aggressive, threatening, verbally abusive, and sometimes vulgar.

The scammers fraudulently identify themselves as IRS agents informing the intended target they owe taxes which are to be paid immediately by gift card, pre-paid debit card, or wire transfer. If payment is refused the scammers then resort to threats of arrest by the local law enforcement agency, deportation, or revocation of licenses.

Here's what you need to know to ensure you don't fall victim to this scam. The IRS will notify you with a letter sent via the U.S. Postal Service if you owe taxes, not by phone, text, email, or social media. They do not ask for personal or financial information over the phone, nor will they demand payment in the form of pre-paid debit card or wire transfer.

According to the IRS website, www.irs.gov, if you get a phone call from someone claiming to be from the IRS and asking for money, here's what you should do:

If you know you owe taxes or think you might owe, call the IRS at 1-800-829-1040. The IRS workers can help you with a payment issue.

If you know you don't owe taxes or have no reason to believe that you do, report the incident to the Treasury Inspector General for Tax Administration (TIGTA) at 1-800-366-4484 or at www.tigta.gov.

You can file a complaint using the FTC Complaint Assistant; choose "Other" and then "Imposter Scams." If the complaint involves someone impersonating the IRS, include the words "IRS Telephone Scam" in the notes."

If you get an email that's purportedly from the IRS, do not open any attachments or click on any links in the email. Send it to phishing@irs.gov.

Avoid phone scams by registering your home and cell phone numbers with the National Do Not Call Registry or by calling 1-888-382-1222. This national registry won't stop all unsolicited calls but will help stop most.

YFAC WORD

WHAT IS SPICE (SYNTHETIC CANNABINOID OR K2)?

Synthetic Spice is a drug that is usually sprayed on dried plants, like oregano or basil. It's sold in a solid form that can be smoked, or in a liquid form that can be turned into vapor. Spice is sometimes called "synthetic marijuana," because the chemicals in Spice are similar to marijuana plants. Spice is also incorrectly labeled as a "safe" or "natural" alternative to marijuana. However, the only natural parts of this drug are the dried plants. Spice is more powerful than the ingredients in marijuana and is dangerous to use.

What are the potential effects of taking Spice?

- Death
- Change in behavior
- Fainting
- Extreme anxiety (nervousness)
- Moodiness
- High blood pressure
- Nausea (feeling sick)
- Vomiting
- Seizures

WHY IS SPICE SO DANGEROUS?

Spice can have unknown, poisonous chemicals in it that cause dangerous health effects. Spice is often sold as an "herbal" product in colorful packages that are attractive to youth. Spice is a man-made drug and you can never be sure that it's safe. For more information call California Poison Control at 1-800-222-1222 or visit www.calpoison.org.





TRANSPORTATION

The Community Services Department Office offers transportation services to serve our residents' needs. Office hours are Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. For further information, please call (909) 596-8700.

SUBSIDIZED PROGRAMS

To purchase these passes, residents must provide proof of La Verne residency in the form of a current utility bill AND proof of current employment from an agency located along the westward bus/train route. Quantities are limited and tickets will be sold on a first-come, first-served basis.

FOOTHILL TRANSIT SUBSIDY – Commuter Express bus line on TAP card. Monthly Foothill Transit passes may be purchased from the 25th of each month through the 10th day of the following month.

SENIOR BUS PASS PROGRAM – The City offers a Senior Bus Pass Program for La Verne residents. Seniors, ages 62 or older, may purchase a Foothill Transit senior bus pass for a subsidized fee. Seniors need to provide proof of age as well as proof of La Verne residency in the form of a current utility bill.

METROLINK SUBSIDY – Monthly passes are available from the Pomona Station to destinations along the westward route. Monthly Metrolink passes may be purchased starting the 20th of each month for the following month. Once registered for the Metrolink Subsidy program with Community Services, monthly passes may also be purchased online.

METRO ACCESS

Metro Access is a curb-to-curb transportation service designed for people with disabilities who are unable to use traditional bus and train service such as the MTA or Foothill Transit services. 




