WHEN IN DOUBT, CALL US OUT!

Often when police get called out to the scene of a crime, such as a residential burglary, they come across potential witnesses that may have seen something, but were indecisive as to whether they should call the police or not. People often try to justify why they shouldn't call, but don't realize that by calling the police they can help prevent a crime from occurring or assist law enforcement in capturing criminals in the process of committing a crime. In an effort to encourage residents to call when they see something suspicious, the La Verne Police Department has outfitted a Ford F-150 truck with a special wrap design that encourages residents to call in anything that looks suspicious. Another justification that residents often use for not calling is that they don't want to bother the police with something they feel is not important. We encourage calling the police when things seem out of place in the neighborhood such as a suspicious vehicle or person. Let the police figure out if a crime has been or is being committed. Residents are the experts in what is normal in their neighborhoods and can be an extra set of eyes for law enforcement. Shortly after the "No Call Too Small" campaign was started, La Verne PD experienced a rise in calls by residents, many of which resulted in the arrest of persons that were in the process of committing crimes or had committed a crime. This is a partnership that is a win, win for law enforcement and the community. Ironically, the truck being used to encourage residents to call in suspicious activity was paid for by assets seized from drug dealers through the court system.

STORM WATER POLLUTION PREVENTION

What is storm water pollution and how is it created?

Storm water pollution is a major environmental issue in California that causes unhealthy water quality in lakes, creeks, rivers, oceans, on beaches and when it floods during heavy rain. It's created when pesticides, trash, cigarette butts, animal waste, motor oil and other contaminants left on the ground wash directly into local waterways. The polluted water eventually mixes with more rainwater and pollutants and ends up being washed into creeks, rivers and the ocean.

What are the problems with it?

Contaminated waterways contribute to risk of wildlife and sea life and beach closures due to high bacteria levels. Dirty water enhances the likelihood of public health issues like increased potential for viral infections, earaches, sinus problems, fever, flu and skin rashes.

What can we do to prevent it?

- Minimize the use of pesticides and fertilizers. Consider using non-toxic or less toxic products. Drought tolerant gardens containing native California plants will also help reduce or eliminate chemical use.
- Always put cigarette butts in an ashtray.
- Throw waste in a trash or recycling bin.
- Clean up pet waste always and promptly.
- Recycle used motor oil. NEVER dump it onto the ground or in the drain. Waste Management offers FREE curbside pickup for their customers and the City of La Verne has three certified collection centers: Auto Zone-1410 Foothill Blvd., Quickies Oil Change-914 Foothill Blvd. and Sunland Tire-2019 Bonita Ave.
- Bring hazardous waste (paint, motor vehicle chemicals, cleaning products, pesticides and herbicides, batteries, pool chemicals, electronics, sharps, light bulbs and mercury thermometers) to a hazardous waste collection event.
- Reduce, Reuse, Recycle - by practicing these steps, we can reduce the waste that will end up in our waterways and water supplies.

What can we do to help fix the problem?

- Join or organize a community clean up event to help protect your waterways.
- Become involved in watershed protection.
- Contact the City of La Verne Public Works Department (909) 596-8741 or 1-888-CLEAN LA to report polluting activity.
- Educate your friends and family on the importance of the small steps we can take daily to reduce storm water pollution.

Local government efforts

Over the past few years, the cities of La Verne, Claremont, Pomona and San Dimas have been collaborating to develop and implement a plan to better manage storm water pollution in the area. This coordinated effort involves enhanced outreach and education, the monitoring of water leaving our communities along with possible projects and methods that will reduce storm water pollution while retaining water in the region that can later be used as a resource. WASTE DISPOSAL

Waste Management offers a variety of services for waste collection that are included in your regular trash rates!

- Each residence (single family homes and multi-family residences) are allowed up to 4 bulky item pickups per year.
- La Verne residents can drop off batteries at City Hall to have them responsibly recycled through Waste Management.
- Used Oil can be picked up curbside by Waste Management IF the oil is left curbside on regular pick up day in an acceptable container (we have free used oil containers at City Hall). Waste Management will then leave an empty acceptable container on the curb for future use.
- Sharps can be disposed of through a mail in program, all you need to do is call Waste Management and request a medical waste package and one will be sent to you.

REDUCING HOLIDAY WASTE

With Thanksgiving and Christmas right around the corner, soon to be followed by dad's and grads, the City of La Verne encourages you to maintain your traditions, but add new twists to help reduce landfill contributions. Throughout the holiday and gift giving season a tremendous increase in waste is regularly seen, most of it is paper. Whether that paper started as a card, wrapped a gift or helped protect a gift during shipping, the environmental impact of that paper will be upon this planet long after the joy of the occasion is gone. Below are some tips to cut down on paper waste.

- Send ½ sheet photo cards or postcards for holiday greetings, instead of more paper intensive thick card stock paper and envelopes. They're usually cheaper to purchase and mail.
- Better yet, consider sending FREE electronic cards, these add sounds and animation to be enjoyed by those around the world without the cost of postage or paper to get there.
- Buy gifts that require minimal wrapping, such as gift cards or concert tickets.
- Suggest that family and friends don't purchase new gifts but gather to volunteer at a hospital, convalescent home or homeless shelter. The memories you create will most likely outlive tangible gifts for you and those you're helping.
- Reuse shipping material for wrapping paper. Apply some stickers or have your children decorate it to add custom pizzazz.
- Eliminate shipping by purchasing gifts locally. This helps reduce waste and keeps more of your money within our community.

CHRISTMAS TREE RECYCLING

Don't forget about the City of La Verne Christmas Tree Recycling Program. On December 28th and January 4th, Waste Management will be picking up Christmas trees that have been placed curbside for recycling. If your tree is six feet or more, please cut it in half and avoid flocked trees if possible, as they cannot be recycled.




YFAC WORD PARENT RESOURCE GUIDE





TRANSPORTATION

The Community Services Office offers transportation services to serve our residents' needs. Office hours are Monday through Thursday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. For further information, please call (909) 596-8700.

SUBSIDIZED PROGRAMS

To purchase these passes, residents must provide proof of La Verne residency in the form of a current utility bill AND proof of current employment from an agency located along the westward bus/train route. Quantities are limited and tickets will be sold on a first-come, first-served basis. For current subsidized rates, please contact us at (909) 596-8700.

FOOTHILL TRANSIT SUBSIDY – Commuter Express bus line on TAP card. Monthly Foothill Transit passes may be purchased from the 25th of each month through the 10th day of the following month.

SENIOR BUS PASS PROGRAM – The City offers a Senior Bus Pass Program for La Verne residents. Seniors, ages 62 or older, may purchase a Foothill Transit senior bus pass for a subsidized fee. Seniors need to provide proof of age as well as proof of La Verne residency in the form of a current utility bill.

METROLINK SUBSIDY – Monthly passes are available from the Pomona Station to destinations along the westward route. Monthly Metrolink passes may be purchased starting the 20th of each month for the following month. Once registered for the Metrolink Subsidy program with Community Services, monthly passes may also be purchased online.

METRO ACCESS

Metro Access is a curb-to-curb transportation service designed for people with disabilities who are unable to use traditional bus and train service such as the MTA or Foothill Transit services. To apply, ask about current rates, or for more information, call Metro Access (800) 827-0829 or (800) 827-1359 for hearing impaired.






